| Work and Income | Civil Defence Payments Civil Defence Payments are available for people who have been affected by the flooding. You don't have to be on a benefit to qualify for a Civil Defence Payment, and non- residents may be eligible. In most cases it doesn't matter what your income is or what assets you have. These can help with: emergency food, clothing and bedding if yours has been damaged or destroyed. accommodation costs if you have been evacuated and are staying in accommodation such as a motel, hotel or temporary rental accommodation. loss of income due to an inability to work caused by the flooding. | Work and Income | Support and assistance is available if you've been directly affected by the flooding in Auckland. In emergencies, Work and Income can help with costs if you don't have any other way of paying. Work and Income also provides other help such as benefits and help with paying your housing costs.
